Dear Parents, Guardians, and Friends of SVdP School,

In this past week, I think I received more expressions of “welcome to Denver” than I did in the entire month of August when I first arrived. It was the temperature warp from 80 degrees one day to 29 degrees (and snow) the following afternoon, that caused many – even non natives – to let me know that I should get used to unpredictability in the coming months: *welcome to Denver; this is how it is!*

Similar to the temperature warp we just experienced, we are also, just this week, in the middle of a liturgical *time* warp. This past Sunday we celebrated the feast of Christ the King and the end of the liturgical year, only to warp back to the beginning of the liturgical year with the season of Advent coming in a few days. I venture to guess that most of us tend to think of Advent as the time that helps us to prepare for Christmas Day and the celebration of the historical event of God coming to earth as an infant. This is good preparation, and the more festive it is in our homes, the better! The Incarnation – God taking flesh and coming to earth – certainly has been the most life-changing event that ever happened in the history of humankind and it should be fully celebrated. But Advent also, and perhaps even more so, is a time when we are preparing for the Second Coming – Christ will come again, not as a weak and dependent infant, but in great glory.

Just like Jesus Christ finally came in flesh and blood as a babe, after years of waiting and centuries of prophesying, he *will come again* in glory and will bring his definitive kingship along with true justice for the earth, when all things will be made right. The readings we will hear in the next few weeks should cause our hearts to long for his coming: they speak of an end to wars, where every tear is wiped away, an end to any and all suffering, a place where the lion will lie down with the lamb, and there will be no sorrow on all God’s holy mountain. Those who work for justice, who compassionately share the load with others, who strive to bring peace to situations of conflict long for this Coming that will somehow set all things right, not just in our own time, but for all of history.

We are made for this kind of peace and perfect justice of being right with God and with others, and they with us. So it is good that we desire it, hope for it, work toward it. But we aren’t there yet. We daily live in the reality of injustice which strikes deep in our hearts when it comes too close to home. Perhaps at no time is it more important for Christians to be Christian than precisely during the experience of injustice, since a response of forgiveness brings divine love directly into a situation. It is a worldly mindset that would combat injustice in similar kind: war for war, hatred for hatred, eye for an eye, silence for silence. But when injustice is met with forgiveness and love, something altogether new happens. Saint John of the Cross says that *where there is no love, put love in, and you will draw love out*. When Christ, whose kingly crown was of thorns and whose throne was a cross, was faced with injustice, he forgave his accusers, prayed for them, loved them. Can you imagine how different the story would be if Jesus had yelled at the soldiers from the cross telling them they are all going to shrivel in Hell if they don’t cut it out? Or if Mary stepped in and frenetically took to task all the parents of the men who were hurting her son? Didn’t they have a right to demand this kind of justice? Why didn’t they choose it? What greater good did they see?

During this Thanksgiving, a time of important and fun family togetherness, let’s examine our hearts and our relationships to see where we might extend forgiveness, even where it has not been asked. Let’s pray for those, especially in our community, whose pain makes such forgiveness so difficult, and ask God to let his grace overflow on all of our families. And let us give heartfelt thanks!
