#### **Outdoor Ecology Lab Update**

This project has been an amazing gift to the school. The number of people in the community who have connected to the school through this project has been exciting and surprising. Many professionals, those related to the school and those who know the school through a family here, have given their time and expertise to this project, giving their creativity and thoughtful consult, as well as giving deep discounts or at-cost or donated labor and supplies to make it as successful and grandiose as it is. Every time you see or hear about the Outdoor Lab at SVdP, please pray that God will bless all who contributed to it; this is our best way of saying "thanks." Just today, one of our dads stopped by the coop and said that he could bring bales of hay from a family farm in Kansas from time to time to help keep us supplied. I have personally felt blessed in many ways through the support and kindness of our community. I am deeply grateful.

The vast majority of the Outdoor Lab is completed, but as with many construction projects, there are a few lingering items. We will have a roof on the shed this week, and will need some interior shelving and supports to hang tools and supplies. We are working on getting live power this week as well. Power will affect the automatic timer on the sprinkler system as well as the evening lighting, and greenhouse heat. We will be preparing for the greenhouse before the ground freezes and installing it in preparation for the early planting season in February.

The chickens will likely make an appearance this week for a few days. The site is not quite prepared to keep them here full time, but they could stay a few days at a time. Please stop by and observe, or be entertained! They are truly enjoyable to watch.

A few notes on the Outdoor Lab space:

- The lab will be treated like a classroom, with students entering under the supervision or direction of a teacher, walking (not running), using materials and tools appropriately, not using any athletic or play equipment in the space, etc.
- We will continue to work on the curriculum this year, so it has not yet been decided which grade level/s will assume responsibility for particular aspects of the Lab.
- However, all classes will be invited into the Lab for an initial orientation and can come as a class any time under a teacher's direction to observe, study, sketch, and pray.
- The landscape architect will speak to our middle school students at some point this year to explain why they have planted particular bushes and plants and how they interact with the environment. We would love for our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students to be able to give knowledgeable tours of the lab to prospective families, parishioners, and donors.
- We are aware that some families are hesitant about student interaction with chickens while others are eager for their children to have opportunities to collect eggs. At this point, we will proceed with realistic caution, asking parent permission for any activity which involves entering the coop to change water, rake, or look for eggs. Chickens are susceptible to human diseases and vice versa, so careful planning is important for keeping us all healthy. Once the greenhouse is installed there will be a fully functioning sink with hot/cold water for hand washing.
- We would like to invite parents / families to visit and care for the chickens on the weekends (once this becomes permanent) and on school breaks when needed. A full orientation will be provided for those who are interested in helping in this way. There will be locks on the coop, but the combinations can be set for families to access the coop when they are caring for chickens on a weekend or a break.
