

What is Accelerated Reader? Accelerated Reader (also referred to as AR by students and teachers) is a computer-based reading program used in grades 1st through 8th that allows teachers to monitor students' independent reading practice. Your child picks a book based on his or her own reading level and interests. After reading the book at his or her own pace, your child will take a short quiz on the computer. These quizzes can be taken in your child's classroom, the SVdP Library, or the SVdP Computer Lab. Quizzes may not be taken at home.

How does SVdP use AR? The score your child receives on the quiz will indicate his or her level of understanding. These scores are used by teachers to monitor growth in your child's reading level as well as by your child to select appropriate free read books. It is also used to ensure that students are practicing independent reading outside of the classroom by setting point goals for students to work towards throughout the year.

How are AR point goals set? AR point goals are assigned to students at the start of each trimester. The goal your child receives is unique to him or her and is calculated based on his or her score from the STAR Reading test administered at the start of the school year. Your child's goal is roughly the amount of points he or she should earn by reading a book on their reading level for 20 minutes a day.

How is my student's AR progress monitored? Every classroom teacher incorporates the AR program differently. However, all students will track their progress in a log during their weekly Library class. Depending on your child's grade, these logs will be reviewed on a monthly or trimester basis. Students in grades 5-8 will have the added challenge of using the Bingo Card pictured below to earn bonus points towards their AR goal.

How can I help my student find success in the AR program? You can receive email updates and track your child's progress by using AR's Home Connect portal. Parents log into Home Connect by using their child's AR username and password. You can find the Home Connect URL at the bottom of this page. You can also help your child by inquiring about the books they choose to read. Ask why they chose a book, what they like or dislike about the book, what they're doing to work towards their AR goal, and, of course, encourage your child to read at home. If your child has questions about a book's AR point value or book level, you can visit the AR Book's Finder page to search books by title or author. How does SVdP reward student success in the AR program? This year, SVdP has adjusted the AR reward system in an effort to make a variety of rewards obtainable for all students. Students will now have a chance to exchange their points at the end of every trimester. The first point exchange for the 2018-2019 school year will occur at the end of the second trimester. If students surpass their AR goal, they can use their surplus points at the exchange in increments of 10 to purchase certificates for a homework pass, lunch in the library, recess in the computer lab, unlimited library checkouts, special dress down days, etc. Students can also exchange their surplus points in increments of 5 to select a mini prize such as a pencil, a bookmark, or a small toy. Prizes will vary each trimester.

Every student who sets and meets his or her goal for a trimester will receive a coupon for a special treat at lunch. Students who met their goal for the first trimester will receive a coupon for ice cream at lunch on Friday, December 1st. Please note that only 4th through 8th grade students set goals for the first trimester, but all students in grades 1st through 8th will have goals to work towards in the second and third trimester.

Students will also have the opportunity to become members of the esteemed "100 Point Club", "200 Point Club" and "300 Point Club" throughout the school year. The members of this special honor roll will be listed at the end of every trimester on a poster in the library. Membership into these clubs are based on the points a student accumulates throughout the entire school year. Students' names will be added to the list as their gain membership, and at the end of each trimester, the names of the members of each club will be shared during morning announcements.
