

## Spelling Bee at SVdP

Can you spell chimichanga, vulcanize, or intaglio correctly on the first try without using your phone or computer? We had to double check our spelling before going to print, but these were some of the favorite words our Spelling Bee participants learned this year with our 5th grade teacher Ms. DeLisle. 4th and 5th graders have the exciting opportunity to participate in the Catholic Schools League (CSAL) Spelling Bee. Starting in November, Spelling Bee students met once a week after school to do various spelling activities and games. The first Spelling Bee was held on January 12th at Good Shepherd, where students first took written tests. Qualifiers from the written test then moved onto oral tests, and could finally qualify for the Advanced Spelling Bee competition that was held on February 2nd. Although no students from SVdP qualified for the Advanced Spelling Bee, it was unanimous that Ms. DeLisle made spelling fun and the students enjoyed making new friends outside of class.

## Crusader Corner- Meet Mr. Boyle

Growing up in Seattle, Chris Boyle always loved school. From the social aspect, to the teachers, to his athletic teams, and even to the homework, school just "clicked" with Mr. Boyle. "School didn't click for me because I was a genius or an angel. School clicked because I was surrounded by teachers, coaches, and administrators who cared about my development as a young person. They afforded me the opportunity to grow and learn in a safe place," he explains. If he was having a hard time or a bad day at school, he knew he could lean on people who cared about him and his journey. His experience at school had a large impact on Mr. Boyle, and inspired him to pursue a career where he could make an impact on students as well. "I got into this



profession so that I could do the same thing for my students. To show them they have a teacher who has their back, believes they can be successful in any facet of their life and is going support and push them to be the best versions of themselves everyday."

Mr. Boyle attended Gonzaga University, earning an undergraduate degree in mathematics, as well as Masters of Initial Teaching in Secondary Mathematics. He recalls always loving numbers even as a child when he would read the Sports and Weather sections off the Seattle Times, just to "scan the raw numbers data" in the standings, statistics and temperatures. Sports played a large part of his childhood too- he remembers using any free minute he had to play basketball in his backyard, sometimes so late his neighbors would phone his parents to ask if he could stop! "Athletics always spoke to me because I found them to be a fairly linear endeavor; the harder I worked, the better results were yielded," he explains. His efforts certainly paid off, leading Mr. Boyle to run cross country at Gonzaga where he earned 1st Team XC All-West Coast Conference honors on two occasions and is the former school record holder at 5000 meters outdoors.

After graduation, Mr. Boyle taught and coached middle and high school students in the Archdiocese of Seattle and then in Portland, Oregon. When he was offered the opportunity to coach at Regis University in the Cross Country and Track program, Mr. Boyle moved to Colorado to coach and begin a Masters in Educational Leadership. After one year of coaching, he realized he missed the classroom and came back to teaching, and luckily to Saint Vincent de Paul.

Now in his first year at SVdP, Mr. Boyle teaches 7th grade pre-algebra, as well as Physical Education for grades 3rd-8th. The energy and excitement he brings to the classroom is contagious and his favorite part of teaching is still connecting with his students. "I love telling students they are awesome and that I think the weird-goofy things they do are awesome!"

In his spare time, Mr. Boyle is working to complete his masters this Spring and still enjoys running as much as he canoften 3-5 miles before school and 6-8 miles in the afternoons. He is also looking forward to traveling to Ireland, where his father is from, this summer to visit family and likely take some long, beautiful runs!
