### Crusader Corner- Father Doug Grandon

When Father Doug Grandon was a young teenager growing up in Sterling, Illinois, he made a seemingly trivial decision that in fact would forever change the course of his life. His parents had dropped him off with a friend to see a movie downtown, but they soon realized they were late and had missed part of the movie. Rather than pay to see only part of a movie, Father Doug and his friend wandered to a nearby coffee shop, where unbeknownst to them, a local church was hosting a free gathering in hopes of sparking a



religious revival, a common practice those days. Growing up in an atheist household, Father Doug had very limited exposure to religion and when he stumbled upon this gathering, he fondly recalls it was his first time hearing the Gospel. After a few more visits, he met Dan, an individual who became his teacher, religious mentor, and lifelong friend.

If you have attended Father Doug's masses, you likely are familiar with parts of his story. In defiance of his parents, who eventually relented, he studied the Gospel with Dan and began attending the local church. The church was also where Father Doug met his wife, Lynn, as a teenager, although he would travel to Yugoslavia and back before they would marry and begin their life together. After serving as a Protestant missionary and pastor and then Episcopal priest, Father Doug began to explore Catholicism. He credits mentor, friend, and Episcopal Bishop Ed McBurney with helping and encouraging him to explore his interest in the Catholic faith. In 2003, Father Doug became Catholic and was ordained a Catholic priest in 2008.

Father Doug's journey is inspiring and we are fortunate that he brings his vast life experiences to Saint Vincent de Paul. A husband and father of six children himself, he is committed "to providing assistance to any family. To help them know God better, learn how to share faith better, live the kind of life that would cause outsiders to want to be Catholic," he explains. His hope for the children of SVdP is the same for everyone he says, "to help them understand how much God loves them."

When you ask a student at SVdP about Father Doug's masses, you will often hear of his infamous "props". Father Doug has always loved sharing the gospel visually and will often bring something representative of his message. You may even meet his beloved

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parrot, Petey, or his lab, Lucy. Father Doug fondly recalls at his parish in Illinois when he used to always carry in something in a red bag. The students would ask with anticipation "what is in the red bag this week?" Upon running into a young student outside of school, he overheard him tell his father, "Look, there's Father Red Bag!" We are thankful for Father Doug's leadership and look forward to what the future, and his bag, holds for SVdP!
