#### What is SVdP Serves?

At SVdP we strive to honor our namesake, St. Vincent de Paul, the patron saint of charitable societies, and inspire service in the hearts of our students through a program called *SVdP Serves*. For 4 years, President Lara O'Shaughnessy has been developing, expanding and orchestrating this now robust program. The mission of *SVdP Serves* is to offer opportunities for our students to be stewards of the faith through education and awareness of the needs of others while creating partnerships within our community. This program is designed to inspire and educate our students in the Corporal Works of Mercy (feeding the hungry, sheltering the



homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, burying the dead, giving alms to the poor). Our school is so blessed to have Lara leading and organizing 2 all-school service days each year, plus 2 service projects per grade level which include a food drive, a diaper drive, and a coat and boot drive. WHEW!! Thank you, Lara!!

*Grade Level Service Projects:* Each grade level is aligned with an agency for one full school year, emphasizing how to serve that segment of society.

<u>Kindergarten – Neighbors (Service Rep: Mollie Smith)</u> Kindergarteners reach out to neighbors with goodwill messages and arts and crafts to be compatible, friendly neighbors.

<u>1<sup>st</sup> – Seniors (Service Rep: Dorie Hoody)</u> The 1<sup>st</sup> Graders make birthday cards for all parishioners 65+ and sing songs, say grace, and make arts and crafts for the senior lunches.

<u>2<sup>nd</sup></u>— Hope Haven Rwanda (Service Rep: Emily Riccio). Through prayers, art work and video exchange, our students learn about Hope Haven, a school in Africa that has grown out of the hardship of genocide and through the love and passion of founder Susan Hollern.

<u>3<sup>rd</sup></u>—<u>Dominican Sisters (Service Rep: Kathleen Davia)</u> 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders learn about the Order of the Dominican Sisters, tour the convent, pray the Novena with the Sisters, create arts and crafts for the Sisters and plant spring gardens at the convent.

<u>4<sup>th</sup>– Asbury School (Service Rep: Darby Barfield)</u> Our children travel to Asbury Elementary and work with a buddy who has learning disabilities and/or adaptive behaviors.



5<sup>th</sup> – Catholic Charities Early Childhood Education Programs (Service <u>Rep: Natalie Urruty, Carissa Money</u>) Our students collect used books to deliver to children at the ECE and partner to read, play and make crafts.

6<sup>th</sup> – Mullen Home for the Aged (Service Rep: Monica Bradac, Laurel Barsa). Our 6<sup>th</sup> graders visit the Mullen Home where our students sing songs and do crafts and play games with the elderly.

<u>7<sup>th</sup> – Women/Family Services (Catholic Charities) (Service Rep:</u> <u>Nancy Belcher</u>) Our 7th graders visited the Samaritan House this fall and made 150 sack lunches and learned about living in poverty.

Kindergartners deliver fall wreaths to the neighbors.

<u>8<sup>th</sup>– Homeless and Low Income Families (Service Rep: Jenae</u> <u>Neiman, Katie McCloskey)</u> 8<sup>th</sup> Grade students organize the schoolwide Thanksgiving Food Drive benefiting over 70 families in the community.

**All School Service Days:** As a school community, SVdP has 2 All School Service Days which allow our students to work with their church buddies to provide a service for 4 additional agencies (on top of the grade level service work that is done all year).

For the first service day this year, students will work with their buddies to make texture toys for Anchor Center for the Blind, blessing bags and rosaries for Christ in the City, Christmas centerpieces for Father Woody's Christmas dinner, and crafty Christmas trees for seniors sponsored by A Little Help.

We encourage you to ask your child about his/her service experience and to research the above agencies to promote deeper discussions with your child about serving in our community.
